

T TAPESTRY WOMEN'S CHOIR

Tapestry Women's Choir is seeking applicants for the director of its 20-24 voice choir to begin directing September 2010.

Tapestry Women's Choir was founded in 1999 and now consists of some 20-24 singers. Concerts include a spring series (early May) and Christmas (early December). Concerts are sung in Colfax and Pullman, Washington and Moscow, Idaho. Occasionally the choir sings a fourth concert in another Palouse area community. Rehearsals begin three to four months prior to concerts and are held weekly in Colfax. New members are accepted via audition.

Tapestry's concerts are noted for their mix of musical styles. Their concerts are as likely to feature a Bach motet as they are a new piece by Gwyneth Walker or Z. Randall Stroope. They may perform swing tunes, traditional carols and spirituals. Concert goers have often commented on how much they appreciate the variety of music they hear. Tapestry's audiences are exposed to the wide range of repertoire available to women's choirs.

In addition to their concerts, the members of Tapestry collaborate locally to support the arts and benefit the communities of the Palouse. They have performed as part of the St. Boniface Piano Benefit in Uniontown, Washington; were the featured artists for the Colfax Arts Council's Meet the Artist series; participated in Pullman Civic Theatre's production of The Sound of Music as the Nun's choir, and collaborated with young musicians from Garfield-Palouse Jr./Sr. High School and Lincoln Middle School in Pullman. Most notably, the choir recently celebrated their 10th anniversary with a commissioned piece, "Shepherd's Song at Christmas" from nationally respected choral composer, Gwyneth Walker.
